1. South Orange Statutory Boards – Boards strictly governed by State statutes and for which appointments are limited to a finite number of individuals for finite terms.
2. South Orange Committees, Advisory Groups and Working Groups – Enabled by the South Orange Board of Trustees, for which appointments typically are made by the Board of Trustees, Village President, or Village President with the advice and consent of the Board.
3. Independent Boards and Committees – Organizations operating independently of the Township of South Orange Village, but which are located in South Orange.

- Learn about the extent to which volunteers contribute to South Orange and to the quality of life enjoyed by residents, students, property and business owners, and visitors.

STATUTORY BOARDS

BOARD OF HEALTH

The Board of Health is an autonomous board that provides all of the activities that are required to meet the minimum performance standards of the State of New Jersey for local boards of health. These activities include environmental health and personal health activities.

ENVIRONMENTAL COMMISSION

The Environmental Commission has the authority to conduct research into the use, and possible use, of land within the municipality, and may coordinate the activities of unofficial bodies organized for similar purposes. It may also prepare, print and distribute books, maps, charts, plans and pamphlets, and may recommend to the planning board and governing body plans and programs for inclusion in the master plan for development and land use.

By law, the Environmental Commission shall keep a list of all open areas, publicly or privately owned, including wetlands, in order to ensure the proper use of such lands. In South Orange, the index of open lands is kept both as part of the Recreation and Open Space Index (ROSI) provided by the Village to the State Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) for all of its Green Acres grants, and by the Village Planner as part of the Master Plan. The environmental commission has advocated to the planning board and the governing body that the open space and public use zoning designation in the zoning ordinance be amended to more specifically reflect the use of our open lands.

PARKING AUTHORITY OF THE TOWNSHIP OF SOUTH ORANGE VILLAGE

The South Orange Parking Authority is an independent Authority, established in 1979. We are responsible for the enforcement and operation of the municipal parking lots, metered spaces, overnight on-street parking, commuter shuttle jitney buses and senior bus services. Its operations are funded by permit and meter revenues. The Parking Authority Board of Commissioners meets on the third Tuesday of every month at 7:15pm in Village Hall, unless otherwise advertised.

PLANNING BOARD

The Planning Board is in charge of permitted activities within the construction department. Their essential duties are to deal with policy and the implementation of that policy through the zoning, site plan and subdivision ordinances. These ordinances establish ground rules which must be met by an applicant. If the applicant meets the requirements of the particular ordinance, the board must approve the subject application. However, a site or subdivision plan can be denied if it does not fulfill a specific requirement of an ordinance.

RENT LEVELING BOARD

The Rent Leveling Board serves to implement the residential rental policies of South Orange Village and to allow tenants and landlords a forum for which various matters can be resolved. The powers of the Board include enforcing rental increase limits, conducting hearings to settle disputes, granting surcharge relief, and setting rules and regulations to implement the rent control ordinance.

ZONING BOARD OF ADJUSTMENT

The purpose of the Zoning Board of Adjustment is to allow special exceptions to the Zoning Ordinance. These exceptions are allowed where the literal enforcement of the provisions of the Zoning Ordinance does not permit any reasonable use of the property. A variance can be requested through site plan approval; however, the applicant must prove a "hardship" in requesting a variance through the Zoning Board of Adjustment. The applicant must prove that his/her inability to comply with area regulations of the zoning district is due to irregular lot size/shape, easements on the property, which may limit the development of the property, etc. Such "hardship" cannot be self-imposed.

CITIZENS BUDGET ADVISORY COMMITTEE (CBAC)

The CBAC provides community input to assist the Village Trustees in making revenue and expense projections and setting tax and service priorities. The Committee advocates for sound fiscal policy by reviewing annual and interim budget submissions, department budgets, and operations. The Committee also makes timely recommendations to both the Finance Committee and Board of Trustees regarding these budgets, and serves as a conduit between Administration and the public.

RIVER CORRIDOR PROJECT COMMITTEE

Beginning in the late 1990s, Main Street volunteers and others created a vision for the east branch of the Rahway River to restore its natural banks, remove invasive weeds, plant trees and native species, enhance fish and other habitat, and provide a walking and bicycling path along the river, connecting train stations, play fields, and downtown destinations. A mayor's advisory committee was created, primarily to steer planning decisions so as to accommodate all of the various interest groups that touched on the river and adjacent fields and urban properties as the environmental permitting and design stages advanced. The committee also coordinates activities with Village government and especially recreation groups.

The River Greenway committee is chaired by Janine Bauer and consists of several residents and others as interested stakeholders. The committee members are appointed by the Village President, and serve at his pleasure. The larger committee meets quarterly, in the evening, on dates set through Village Hall and at the convenience of the committee members. A smaller management committee meets more frequently, as needed, to resolve design and other problems. The public is invited to attend and welcome to comment on all aspects of the project.

The Board of Education is the governing body of the South Orange - Maplewood School District with responsibility for developing policy to ensure the proper care, management and control of District affairs. The Board consists of nine citizens elected at large by the voters of South Orange and Maplewood. Board members serve three year terms, with three members of the Board subject to election each year.

In addition to setting policy, the Board hires the superintendent; approves staff hirings, transfers, resignations, terminations, and leaves of absence; approves expenditures; approves educational programs (curriculum); and otherwise ensures that the facilities and equipment are available to support learning and teaching in the District. The Board also approves the budget for the School District. However, the tax levy is approved by a separate entity, the Board of School Estimate, which is comprised of three members of the Village Trustees of South Orange, three members of the Township Committee of Maplewood and two members of the Board of Education.
